

## Five-Storied Pagoda at Rurikoji Temple 45 🛗 🚟









Counted among Japan's three great pagodas for its beauty, the pagoda at Rurikoji Temple is Japan's tenth oldest existing open-air five-storied pagoda. The view of the temple illuminated at night is also an impressive sight.



## Kintaikyo Bridge







The rugged girder assembly technique used for the beautiful arches of the Kintaikyo Bridge has earned it a place as one of Japan's three most famous bridges. Visitors will enjoy the scenery around the bridge at any time of the year. \*Bridge admission fees must be placed in the admission box outside business hours.

## Iwakuni Castle







Located at an altitude of 200 m atop a hill, Iwakuni Castle is conveniently accessible by a ropeway. The view from the castle observatory presents visitors with the city of Iwakuni below. \*Opening dates vary according to season.

## White-Walled Townscape in Yanai 📆 🛗 🟯



Yanai features a flowing landscape of white-walled buildings and stone pavement. During the night in summer, the eaves of the houses are lit up with goldfish-shaped lanterns. Visitors can also tour the residence of a wealthy Edo Era merchant.
