

#### Shimanami Kaido Cycling (Ehime Area)







The Shimanami Kaido features the three continuous bridges that make up the Kurushima Kaikyo Bridge, the world's first triple-suspension bridge. This roughly 4-km long bridge provides cyclists with a ride high above the sea.

Oyamazumi Shrine's Treasure Hall features numerous national treasures and important cultural properties. The many displays of traditional armor and helmets account for some 80% of all artefacts in Japan and include the only Japanese armor designed for women in existence. The shrine is a must-see location for fans of samurai.


