### Ritsurin Garden Illumination Takamatsu City, Kagawa] March - April

Ritsurin Garden is known as the garden that offers a differer beautiful scene with every step. The garden's main attraction besides cherry blossoms in spring and foliage in autumn is the garden's illuminated nighttime scenery.

## Hagi Jidai Matsuri Festival [Hagi City, Yamaguchi] November

The more than 200 staff dressed as lords and irregular militia (kiheitai) from the reign of the Mori Clan parading around the town of Hagi make the Hagi Jidai Matsuri Festival a scene straight from a historic picture scroll.

## Matsuyama Autumn Festival Matsuyama City, Ehime] October

The Matsuvama Autumn Festival includes groups of young men carrying miniature shrines jostling each other with all their might. The boisterous shouts of the men and the ferocious clashing of the floats make this a lively event.



Former Shizutani School Illumination [Bizen City, Okayama]

The red and yellow of the school's Chinese pistache tree—brought to Japan as seeds from a Confucius Temple in China—present a dazzling display of autumn foliage. The maples and autumn foliage offer a beautiful sight.



## Nada no Kenka Matsuri (Fighting Festival) [Himeji City, Hyogo] October

Called one of the oddest festivals in the world, the Nada no Kenka Matsuri Fighting Festival features portable shrines that are jolted against one another. This festival is known as the largest of many similar "fighting festivals."



### Chosa Matsuri Festival [Kan-onji City, Kagawa] October

During the Chosa Matsuri Festival, 23 "chosa" (floats) richly decorated with gold embroidery are paraded through the city. The impressive splendor of the floats makes this a truly special festival.

Kangensai Festival July or August [Miyajima-cho, Hatsukaichi City, Hiroshima]

The Kangensai Festival is held on a boat traveling from Itsukushima Shrine to its opposite shore and back to the sound of wind and string instruments. The festival climax begins with the sun beginning to set as the boat returns to the shrine's great red torii.

## Awa Odori Dance Festival

[Tokushima City, Tokushima] August

The Awa Odori Dance Festival, which began more than 400 years ago, is one of Tokushima's most prominent summer festivals. Let the music take you and feel free to join in on the dancing festivities





Summer Garden of Dreams, Okayama Korakuen Garden [Okayama City, Okayama]

This summer nighttime festival invites revelers to enjoy food and drink while admiring the delicately designed illumination bathing Korakuen



Onmaku Festival [Imabari City, Ehime] August

The Imabari Festival includes a variety of events—including lion dances and other traditional dances performed to music—that cannot be found anywhere else in Japan. One such must-see event is the fireworks display



Akiyoshidai Mountain-Burning Event [Mine City, Yamaguchi] February

This annual event marks the start of spring as flames race across the Akivoshidai Plateau, leaving the mountainside black in their wake.



Hiroshima Dreamination [Hiroshima City, Hiroshima]

The fairyland theme of Hiroshima Dreamination sets the mood as various objects decorated with colorful illuminations appear throughout the city.
