



Senkoji Park [Onomichi City, Hiroshima] ≫ ₽.23

In spring, Senkoji Park is filled with cherry trees, and at night, visitors can revel in the glow of paper lanterns illuminating the pink and white blossoms.







## Miroshima Castle [Hiroshima City, Hiroshima] Sometimes called Carp Castle, Hiroshima Castle was built by Terumoto Mori. Inside the castle grounds, visitors will find a cherry blossom-viewing are toward the center where some 480 cherry trees can be seen in bloom. . Access: 15 minutes on foot from "Kamiya-cho-higashi" Sta. on the Hiroshima Electric Railway

## Dogo Park [Matsuyama City, Ehime]

From early March, some 30 Camellia winter cherry trees begin blooming throughout Yuzuki Castle ruins, and in late March some 370 Yoshino cherry trees begin to bloom. 

Access: Directly accessible from \* Dogokoen" Sta. on the Iyo Railway



## Mt. Bizan [Tokushima City, Tokushima] Come spring, the cherry blossoms in Mt. Bizan's summit park begin to bloom. The cherry blossom's

splash of color fuses with the natural landscape of the summit for a magnificent scene that spreads across the mountain. Access: 10 minutes on foot from JR Tokushima Sta. to Awa Odori Hall (5F, Bizan Ropeway Sanroku Sta.), and then 6 minutes to Mt. Bizan summit



Mt. Myoken [Naruto City, Tokushima]

The collection of some 500 cherry trees-including wild cherry, double-flowered cherry, and Yoshino cherry trees-makes for a breathtaking sight.


Access: 20 minutes on foot from JR Naruto Sta.
